Shawn Rice isn't your normal Sun City retiree. In fact, she's not retired at all. She works full time as the Sun City Pioneer Center, coordinating the resident's events and activities. When she's not doing that, however, you can probably find her on the pickleball courts.

She likes to play against those with higher skill levels in an effort to improve but still finds time to go out with friends and play for fun. She also doesn't mind taking a new player under her wings and teaching them the rones.

"I just tell people to go out and try it," she said. "You'll know your comfort level, to say 'I can do that or I can't do that.' If you're playing socially, it doesn't matter. Just laugh and have fun and enjoy life."

The hardest part about picking up the game might just be the availability of courts as the sport has enjoyed a boom among the senior set. Sun City is working on that though. The community currently has six courts, but are currently adding 10 more. The City of Mesquite also has plans to build more courts as well to accommodate demand.

"Right now, there's usually about 40 people trying to get on the six courts here (in Sun City)," Rice said.

Rice and Hartman initially moved to Mesquite for a different reason. They are both avid hikers and can be found on most weekends on des-

ert trails.
